During the summer holidays (from 27.07 to 24.08.2019) we, Magnus Haggenev and Kevin Born, flew from Düsseldorf to Vadodara in the state of Gujarat, in the northwest of India. During our internship at HAVER & BOECKER India we accompanied the production for four weeks and assisted in the assembly of the M & L-Series, from rethreading the thread to the incoming and outgoing test. During this time we were able to use our skills from our first apprenticeship (plant and industrial mechanic) as well as expand our specialist knowledge for our second apprenticeship as an electronic technician for industrial engineering.

The monsoon season in India showed its most powerful side. For days there was rain, knee-high water and crocodiles that swam from the rivers into the city. Many roads were closed and there was no chance to get into the city to the apartment. So we spent our first night after landing with our colleagues in the company. Together we let the evening end with Indian food and a cricket game in the hall. We really enjoyed the cheerful atmosphere among the colleagues.

A normal working day for us began at 9:00 am, was interrupted by a half-hour lunch break and ended at 5:30 pm. We also worked every second Saturday. In total there are about 50 employees in this subsidiary, in the workshop alone about 20 mechanics and electronics technicians. We found the atmosphere among each other to be friendly and respectful and we were integrated very nicely and openly into the staff.

During our stay we also had the opportunity to accompany an experienced service technician. In doing so we extended an INTEGRA (two nozzles) and a NEWTEC palletizer with a Quattro System-Monitoring Unit. We also had the opportunity to get to know an Indian chemical company where various HAVER & BOECKER systems are running, from the latest INTEGRA to a forty year old single-spout manual palletiser and finally palletising by man power.

We used the time on a long weekend to travel to Goa and Mumbai to get to know the country and its people even better. In Goa we enjoyed the flair of the great beaches. During our stay in Mumbai, a city of 17 million inhabitants, we could immerse ourselves in the atmosphere of the big city and gather impressions that would otherwise not be possible. We visited various sights such as the Gateway of India, which is considered one of the most famous landmarks of India.
