Niklas Bökamp and Niklas Nuphaus: We worked in the production. One of our main tasks was to overhaul and assemble a previously dismantled, used 2-port series packer. The mechanical assembly, the electrical installation and the installation of pneumatics was part of our tasks. The review of the used assemblies was also included. Depending on the condition, we replaced the worn components with spare parts. We also worked on the assembly and completion of an INTEGRA. The cooperation with our American colleagues was very instructive for us and also gave us a lot of pleasure.

Kristina and Johanna: We helped the engineering department staff and were able to learn a lot. With the support of our German and American colleagues, who helped us immediately with questions and problems, we were also able to work independently on small projects such as on a roller cart or a machine touchpad holder made of Bosch profiles.

In our free time, we four drove out of Conyers and visited nearby cities like Atlanta with its sights. Next to the aquarium and the Coca-Cola Museum, we saw a laser show at Stone Mountain Park and went hiking there. Extensive shopping in the outlets was of course not to be missed.
